Five Tips To Get The Most Out Of Your Dumpster Rental

Renting a dumpster allows you to tackle even the biggest projects all at once, but there are some ways that you can maximize the potential of your dumpster. Put Large Items at the Bottom

Not only does this make for safer loading, but it will help you optimize the space you take up. Large items like couches, chairs, dressers can be carried in before anything else is in the dumpster making it easy for you and a helper to load it in the dumpster.

Spread Out the Weight

While you are bringing those large items in be sure to spread the weight out. Start at the front and do your best to place large items on opposite sides of the dumpster. This not only helps you preserve more space for smaller items, but it helps us transport the load more safely.

Break It Down

Can an item be made smaller? This will help with filling in gaps and wastes less space. Recliner chairs can often be separated into two pieces, fans and lamps can be taken off their bases, drywall and cardboard can be broken into smaller pieces. You can even take this to the next level and use a reciprocating saw to cut furniture items even smaller. The point is the smaller the items you put in the more space you'll gain.

Fill All the Holes

Work in layers as you fill. Once the bottom is loaded with the largest items put smaller items in the gaps around them. This is real life Tetris. Work from large to small. Once that layer is packed you can start on the next layer. If you just toss items in haphazardly then you will miss the opportunity to get at all the voids that can be found around larger items.

U#5 Don't Go Past the Top

Overfilling the dumpster doesn't just make it more dangerous when we pick up and transport the dumpster, but overfilling can lead to going over the dumpsters weight capacity. When this happens you could be subject to an added charge. If you have followed all the other tips in this guide then we're confident that you should have plenty of room left.
